Does the Quran promise the Muslims 72 virgins?

Muslim men are promised that when they die, they will go to heaven where 72 virgins await them for their eternal sexual pleasure.¹ Men in Islam are permitted four wives. Muhammad had 16 so-called wives and 22 other concubines.

The bible says that marriage is one man and one woman in covenant (Gen. 2:18–24) for life (Mt 19:6, Rom. 7:2, 3). When the religious leaders asked Jesus his thoughts on divorce, he did not lower heaven's standards to suit their liking; rather, he reaffirmed the marriage covenant (Ps 19:7).

He said:

"Moses, because of the hardness of your hearts, permitted you to divorce your wives but from the beginning it was not so. And I say to you, whoever divorces his wife, except for sexual immorality², and marries another, commits adultery; and whoever marries her who is divorced commits adultery." Mt 19:8–9

The modern word dishonors marriage (Heb 13:4); but, the Lord said that in the beginning divorce "was not so".³

Jesus' disciples replied: "If the relationship of a man with his wife is like this, it's better not to marry!" Mt 19:10

Jesus answered: "Not everyone can accept this saying, but only those it has been given to." Mt 19:11

Those who live in the Spirit of God are able to: love, honor and cherish their spouse for life (Mt 19:6, Rom. 7:2, 3). The apostle Paul wrote: If you live according to the flesh you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live (Ro 8:13).

The believer is enabled to live on a higher plain than that of the world. Paul wrote: Be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God (Ro 12:1–2). Those who are stiff-necked and hard-hearted resist God and fail to live according to his will (Ac 7:51).

Satan has no raw material. He takes the good things of God and perverts them (Jas 1:17). To mock love and marriage he promotes adultery (Ex 20:14).⁴ When a culture no longer calls an abomination an abomination⁵—that is the beginning of the end of said culture (Ps 33:12).

Marriage should display Christ's union with his church to a watching world (Eph. 5:23–32). The denial of marriage is a sign of apostasy (1 Tim. 4:1–3). It is a prophetic sign of the end times (Jer. 16:2).

Paul wrote:

But know this, that in the last days perilous times will come: For men will be lovers of themselves, lovers of money, boasters, proud, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, unthankful, unholy, unloving, unforgiving, slanderers, without self-control, brutal, despisers of good, traitors, headstrong, haughty, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, having a form of godliness but denying its power. And from such people turn away! 2 Ti 3:1–5

God will not always strive with rebellious men (Ge 6:3). Disobedience leads to death (Jas 1:15).

Paul wrote:

And even as they did not like to retain God in their knowledge, God gave them over to a reprobate mind, to do those things which are not convenient; Being filled with all unrighteousness, fornication, wickedness, covetousness, maliciousness; full of envy, murder, debate, deceit, malignity; whisperers, Backbiters, haters of God, despiteful, proud, boasters, inventors of evil things, disobedient to parents, Without understanding, covenant breakers, without natural affection, implacable, unmerciful: Who knowing the judgment of God, that they which commit such things are worthy of death, not only do the same, but have pleasure in them that do them (Ro 1:27–32).

When one is given over to a depraved mind, he develops affections for strange flesh.⁶ Once Satan is given a foothold in an individual's life, he has authority to demonize him (Eph 6:12).⁷

Part of the judgment toward men practicing idolatry⁸ is that they become like the gods they worship (Ps 115:8, 135:18). Because they have made God into an idol for their own twisted purposes (Is 44:9, Ro 1:28-31, Jn 16:2), they become unable to see or hear the things of the true and living God.

Muhammad was a false prophet (2 Pe 2:1).⁹ He will be judged by Jesus for his own perversion (Ex 20:14) and for leading others astray (Jn 5:22). He erred in his teaching regarding marriage on earth (Ex 20:14) and in heaven.

Jesus said: "For in the resurrection they neither marry, nor are given in marriage, but are as the angels of God in heaven." Mt 22:30.
