






Abraham and Isaac: Genesis 12-25

God's First Promise to Abram

God promises to make Abram into a great nation and that he will bless him and make his name great. God tells Abram to leave, so Abram leaves Haran for Canaan taking with him his wife Sarai, his nephew Lot, and all of his possessions and servants (c. 2091 BC).

God's Third Promise to Abram



Jacob and Joseph: Genesis 31-50

Jacob (Israel) (2005-1859)

Rebekah gives birth to twins, Jacob and Esau. God tells Rebekah that two nations will come from her womb, one will be stronger, and the elder will serve the younger (c. 2005 BC).

 Abraham dies when he is 175 years old, Isaac and Ishmael bury him in the cave of Machpelah in Hebron with his wife Sarah, Abraham leaves everything he owns to his son Isaac (c. 1991 BC).



* Esau sells his birthright (the firstborn's right to the family inheritance) to Jacob for some stew.

Alsaac travels to Gerar to escape a famine, Isaac tells King Abimelech and his people that his wife, Rebekah, is his sister. His trickery is discovered.

God's First Promise to Isaac

God tells Isaac not to go to Egypt but to stay in Canaan. God promises Isaac that he will bless him and his descendants with all the land of Canaan. God also tells Isaac that he will make his offspring as numerous as the stars of heaven.

- Isaac moves to Beer-sheba.
- * Isaac and King Abimelech swear an oath of peace in Beer-sheba.
- God's Second Promise to Isaac While staying in Beer-sheba, God reaffirms the promise he made to Abraham. Isaac builds an altar to the LORD.

Jacob returns to Canaan (c. 1908 BC).

- *Laban confronts Jacob in Gilead and they make a covenant with each other.
- * Jacob sends gifts to Esau.
- * Jacob wrestles with an angel at Penuel and is renamed "Israel."
- *Jacob and Esau meet upon Jacob's return.
 - Jacob settles near Shechem.
 - * Jacob's daughter, Dinah, is raped in Shechem and her brothers avenge her.
 - Jacob moves to Bethel.

God's Second Promise to Jacob

Jacob builds an altar in Bethel. God appears to Jacob, reaffirms the promise made to Abraham, and again informs Jacob that his name is now Israel.

Rachel dies near Bethlehem while giving birth to Benjamin.

- Benjamin, Rachel's second son (Jacob's 12th son) is born.
- Jacob (Israel) moves to Hebron.

* Jacob's favoritism of Joseph, Joseph's coat, and Joseph's dreams cause his brothers to hate him and they plot to kill him (c.1897 BC).

* Joseph is sold by his brothers to


Ishmaelite traders on their way to Egypt for 20 pieces of silver. Joseph is sold to Potiphar. Pharaoh's official and captain of the guard. Jacob (Israel) thinks

Joseph is dead (c. 1896 BC).

 - * Joseph is imprisoned because of Potiphar's wife's false accusations.



* Joseph's brothers go to Egypt to buy food during the famine (c. 1876 BC).

*Joseph tests his brothers the first time (c. 1876 BC).

* Joseph plans a banquet for his brothers (c. 1875 BC).

*Joseph tests his brothers a second time and then reveals his identity to them (c. 1875 BC).

▲ Jacob's family, now referred to as "Israelites" or "the children of Israel," move to Egypt to live with Joseph and escape the famine. Pharaoh allows them to raise sheep in the land of Goshen (Rameses) and he also puts them in charge of his own livestock (c. 1875 вс).

God's Third Promise to Jacob

On the way to Egypt, God appears to Jacob in a vision and promises Jacob that he will make him into a great nation and bring his descendants back to Canaan (the promised land) from Egypt.

*Jacob, Joseph's father, meets Pharaoh (c. 1875 BC).

★ Jacob (Israel) settles in Goshen. The Israelites gain possessions, are fruitful, and multiply.

Joseph reveals his identity to his brothers.

- Jacob (Israel) blesses Joseph's sons (Manasseh and Ephraim) and gives them status as tribes of Israel instead of their father. Jacob says his last words to the rest of his sons, and dies at the age of 147. He is buried with Abraham, Sarah, and Isaac in the cave of the field at Machpelah, near Mamre (c. 1859 Bc).
- After Jacob's death, Joseph tells them that what they intended for evil, God meant for good in order to preserve His people.

Joseph dies when he is 110 years old. His final request is that his bones be carried to Canaan when God delivers them from Egypt.

During the Exodus, Moses takes the bones of Joseph with him. They are buried in Shechem in the Promised Land of Canaan.
