

What is victorious battle seed?

Femi Emmanuel of Livingspring Chapel International in Nigeria is a prosperity teacher (2 Pe 2:1) defining a battle seed as “[v]ictory in one battle [which] enlists you for another, so [w]hen you have a challenge, do not just pray or fast and leave it to God. Give a battle seed.”¹ Emmanuel claims that he, himself cannot become poor because he has given so much.²

The scriptures do not teach that one gives—to get. The apostle Paul said, “Each person should do as he has decided in his heart—not reluctantly or out of necessity, for God loves a cheerful giver (2 Co 9:7).” No good thing done for God’s kingdom will go unrewarded (Col 3:23).

Jesus taught that with only a small amount of faith, one can move mountains (Mt 17:20). Believers overcome by: God’s Word (Eph 6:17), His armor (Eph 6:10–17), having faith (1 Jn 5:4, 5) and trusting in His promise (Jn 16:33).³

Imagery of a seed appears in the Bible as God’s promise that the “seed of the woman” will one day defeat evil (Ge 3:15).
